

# Did you know...?

**Did you know that breakfast is available each day at your student's school?** Eating a nutritious breakfast helps students achieve the classroom goals set for them. National studies consistently confirm that breakfast helps kids concentrate, think, behave and learn. Eating breakfast:

- improves children's classroom performance, including better test scores and grades
- increases children's ability to focus and concentrate on school work
- decreases behavior problems, tardiness and visits to the school nurse
- increases attendance rates
- decreases risk of food insecurity and hunger that impair development and learning
- may protect against childhood obesity



If it is difficult to fit breakfast into your morning routine, breakfast is available in all schools. A student must choose a full portion of at least three different items to receive a reimbursable school breakfast. One of the three items must be ½ cup of fruit or juice. Breakfast items include: protein, grain, fruit/juice, and milk.

Don't forget – if your child receives free or reduced meals, they are eligible for one breakfast and one lunch per day as part of this benefit. All breakfast and lunch meal choices are available for all students regardless of eligibility status.

# Free/Reduced Meal Application Deadline Nears

Food Services is up-to-date on all processing of free/reduced meal applications. If you know of someone who is waiting, please have them call the Food Service Office at 913-993-9710.

Phone calls will be going out to all families that have not re-applied for the free/reduced program this year over the next couple of weeks. Federal guidelines allow students to have a grace period each year at the start of school in order to have time to complete the application process; however, that grace period, ends on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>September 27</u>, **2016**.

# Nurse's Notes

If your child needs medication during school hours, the medication must come in the original box/bottle with the pharmacy label attached (see guidelines on following page). #### Immunize: It's the Law!

Kansas Law K.A.R. 28-1-20 defines immunizations required for any individual who attends school or early childhood programs operated by a school. Parents of students who are not compliant with KS Immunization requirements will be notified three times: at 30, 60 and 90 days of noncompliance. Students remaining noncompliant after 90 days will be excluded from attending class until compliance is met. If you have questions regarding your child's immunization status, please contact Julie Johnston, BA School Nurse.



#### **Hearing and Vision Screening**



Hearing screening will be conducted this year for PREK, KDG, 1st, 3rd, and 5th grades and all new students to SMSD. Vision testing was completed last week. Referral notices have been sent home with students who needed them. Hearing screenings will begin in September and hopefully be completed by Thanksgiving. You will be notified if your child does not pass the screenings.



## **Broken Arrow Dental Screening**

Broken Arrow will be providing a free dental screening to all students enrolled in PREK-6 on Wednesday, October 26, 2016. In compliance with Kansas State Statute 72-5201, all district students will be screened unless the parent does not want their child to participate in the screening. The screening will be provided at your child's school and will be at no charge. Oral health is an important part of children's overall health, and is a critical component in their ability to learn and succeed at school. You may request to opt your child out of the screening, by notifying the nurse. If your child does participate, a copy of the screening results will be sent home with your child. If you have any questions, feel free to contact me at school at 913-993-2302, or by email at <a href="mailto:juliejohnston@smsd.org">juliejohnston@smsd.org</a>. If you don't have a dental home and would like your child to receive dental care at school, Broken Arrow partners with Health Partnership Clinic's dentist, Dr. Mollie Day. She and her team of hygienists come to BA several times each year to treat students' dental needs at school. She accepts those with insurance and those without. Let me know if you'd like your child to receive dental care at school.

#### **Medication Administration Guidelines\***

**Permission**: Written permission from the parent or guardian must be on file for all medications given at school, including over-the-counter (OTC) medications. Authorization must be renewed every school year.

**Medication**: Only FDA approved prescription and OTC medications are allowed to be administered by school personnel. OTC medications will be given per package label dosing instructions, unless prescribed by a physician.

**Container**: Prescription medication brought to school must be in the original container with a current prescription label on the bottle including the child's name, doctor's name, date, medication name, dosage, and time to be given. Controlled substances must be submitted with a Medication Count Form. OTC medications provided by parent must be in the original container and labeled with the student's name.

#### **School Hours**

As another school year begins, it's a good time to review basic school hours so parents know when the children are expected to be



at the building. Students should not be at school too early in the morning or too late in the afternoon. This is a safety issue as teachers are not on duty to supervise children outside of these time periods. Parents are asked to adhere to this schedule and to notify the school office if emergencies prohibit them from doing so.

7:00am The JCPRD room opens for those signed up for the Before School Childcare Program. (Info available in the school office.)

7:40am Breakfast opens in the MPR. (Those not eating breakfast will line up outside the building and wait to enter the building.)

**7:50am** School doors open for those not eating breakfast. Students will move to the gym where teachers will supervise them.

**8:00am** Classrooms open and students are escorted from the gym and MPR to their homerooms.

**8:10am** Tardy Bell rings. Students are expected to be in their classrooms and ready to start the day.

**3:05pm** Bus students dismissed from the classrooms to make their way to the busses.

**3:10pm** School day ends and all students are escorted to the exits.

**3:25pm** Students not picked up are escorted inside to make phone calls to missing parents. Parents will need to park and come inside to sign out your student. We strongly discourage pickup after 3:30pm, since teachers are off duty and there is no supervision. Please be proactive and contact the school ASAP if you will not arrive by 3:25pm.
